The 2nd International Conference on Trauma and Mental Health, held at the Notre Dame Center in Jerusalem from 18-20 September 2022, was hosted by AUSiMED, with the support of co-hosts Phoenix Australia, Hadassah Australia and Hadassah Medical Organization.

The conference was designed to explore the key issues faced by psychologist, psychiatrist, GPs, social workers, counsellors and others working with living with PSD including people in ongoing conflict zones, refugees and displaced people and people affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The conference reflected the ongoing commitment of the Conference hosts to collaboratively and inclusively promote scientific discourse and share new knowledge in order to continually improve delivery and effectiveness of trauma-related mental health treatment, locally in Israel and Palestine, regionally and globally.

THE CONFERENCE PARTICIPANTS

The conference committees developed a truly international event with:

- Five high-profile international keynote speakers
- Participants from 15 countries including Australia, UK, USA, Europe and the middle east.
- 100 oral presentations and 30 poster presentations
- 236 researchers and healthcare professionals in attendance





THE CONFERENCE KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Professor Richard Bryant, Scientia Professor of Psychology at the University of New South Wales, spoke on **World Health Organisation mental health programs for refugees and displaced persons**.

Sir Professor Sir Simon Wessely, professor of psychological medicine at the Institute of Psychiatry, King's College London AND Director of the King's Centre for Military Health Research, spoke on **adversity and mental health in the UK mental health service.**

Professor Barbara Rothbaum, a clinical psychologist and a professor in the Psychiatry department at Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta, USA. She is a pioneer in the treatment of anxiety-related disorders with a speciality in posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Prof Rothbaum spoke on her work in the **treatment of PTSD**.

Professor Tine Jensen, Professor of Psychology at the University of Oslo and Research Professor at the Norwegian Centre for Violence and Traumatic Stress Studies, spoke on the **treatment of trauma affected children and adolescents**.

Dr Rick Doblin, the founder and executive director of the Multidisciplinary Association for Psychedelic Studies (MAPS), spoke on **MDMA-assisted therapies and the healing of trauma**.

THE CONFERENCE OUTCOMES

The conference gave over 230 mental health practitioners and researchers access to **world-leading experts** who gave step-by-step guidance in the most effective treatments available for trauma-related disorders and also outlined their thoughts about the next generation of treatment developments.

The conference facilitated the formation of **new and deepened collaborations** between mental health practitioners and researchers both regionally and globally. Notably, two important opportunities to introduce new PTSD treatments to Australia were identified:

- Prof Shai Efrati's work on hyperbaric oxygen therapy and its use for treatment resistant PTSD and long-Covid; and
- 2) Professor Yair Bar Haim's recent innovations in the **treatment of PTSD** which has successfully targeted PTSD specific symptoms. This is the first time treatment of specific PTSD symptoms has been achieved with precision.

The conference brought a high-level delegation of mental health experts from Turkey to Israel, opening up new links between Israel and Turkey and between AUSIMED and the Turkish community of Australia.

The Turkish delegation's attendance at the conference opened discussions with Phoenix Australia that will see the introduction of new learnings from Turkey about trauma services for refugees into a new Victorian government-funded state-wide trauma initiative.
